Call for Late Breaker Abstracts Submission Deadline: August 31, 2017

The deadline for late breaker abstract submission is August 31, 2017. Abstracts received after the deadline will not be considered. Authors will be notified of the acceptance of their abstract by email by September 15, 2017.

Submission instructions

Abstracts must be submitted as a Word file via the online submission form (see below).

You can submit several abstracts at the same time:

- click on the link below to start
- fill out your personal data and go through the submission procedure.

Your abstract(s) is/are only uploaded successfully when you receive an automatic reply confirming your submission(s).

IMPORTANT: The uploaded Word file(s) must contain Title, authors & affiliations and the actual abstract.

Please read the author instructions carefully before submitting your abstract(s).

Instructions for authors

- Abstracts must be written in English and must be submitted as a Word file (.doc or .docx) via the online submission form.
- List maximum 10 authors.
- Abstract text is limited to maximum 350 words (abstract text <u>excludes</u> the title, authors and affiliations).
- Use font Arial 10 characters per inch (font size 10)
- Use single spacing and type the text unjustified without hyphenating words at line breaks. Use hard returns only to end headings and paragraphs, not to rearrange lines.
- Type title in sentence case in bold with no full stop at the end

- Type family name first followed by the initials of the first name of the authors (Rubens P.P., Van Eyck J. etc.)
- Type affiliation underneath the authors: Institution, Dept., City, Country (do not mention street addresses, PO boxes or zip codes). When there are multiple affiliations number them as follows and use the semi-colon between the multiple affiliations:

¹Dept. A, Organisation A, City, Country; ²Dept. B, Organisation B, City, Country; ³Dept. C, Organisation C, City, Country

Ideally, your abstract is structured as follows: Introduction / Aim / Methods / Results /
Conclusion. In structured abstracts, paragraph headings should be typed in bold followed by
a colon. Do not use the heading 'Abstract'. Start each heading on a new line, but do not
insert blank lines in between them:

Introduction: Following by text.

Aim: Following by text.
Methods: Following by text.
Results: Following by text.
Conclusion: Following by text.

• The use of References is discouraged and must be limited to max 3. When you list references use superscript numbers in both the text and the reference list. Use Arial font size 8 for references.
